#### **HSCP** draft Terms of Reference

BB went through the draft Terms of Reference. This was agreed but members wished further time to read through, with the addition of:

Strategic link with the SAB to be added to Section 4; Education to be included in the Partnership meetings and not the Executive as well; note use of term "NHS CCG North East London"; inclusion of the voice of the child.

## **New Arrangements Discussion:**

Executive as three Statutory Partners wished to sign-off redacted Executive and Partnership minutes for the website plus any statements, finances and documents.

There were still opportunities to work on a three borough basis on over-arching themes, eg Domestic Abuse.

They valued the role of the Independent Chair and Scrutineer as critical friends.

It was noted that the Statutory Partners were very busy and so at times might need to delegate issues.

#### Action 1

Budget;

Participation and hearing the Voice of the Child options- hearing real life stories, but noting that this would need support; asking a participation group to explore an issue for the Partnership; consideration of a Participation subgroup, which would then feedback into other



Partnership workstreams; to consider options for a Lay Member and role of Elected Members.

# **Child Q Hackney Discussion**

LB had audited BCU cases of intimate stop and search for 2021. He would be auditing other time periods in addition. He was satisfied that the processes were managed well by the BCU Tri-borough and for Havering children in particular and that the very few cases were appropriately undertaken.

BB was reassured on behalf of the Partnership.

**Action 2** LB and RS to liaise re Police discussing systemic issue with school leadership groups, students and parents.
