Havering Borough Council Guide to supply feedback for Provider Locality Risk Assessment

Overview

All children's homes and regulated supported accommodation for young people must create a Locality Risk Assessment. If a resource is being planned or operating in Havering the provider must obtain information from Havering Borough Council, the Metropolitan Police and North East London Integrated Commissioning Board (health).

The council is required to provide public information based upon a locality; this does not include personal information of any resident. The council supplies information, not an assessment of the location, or the appropriateness of the site, for a children's service, this is the responsibility of the Provider delivering the service.

Demographics

Havering is the third largest London borough, covering some 43 square miles. It is located on the northeast boundary of Greater London. To the north and east, the Borough is bordered by the Essex countryside, to the south by a three-mile River Thames frontage, and to the west by the neighbouring boroughs of Redbridge and Barking & Dagenham.

The Census 2021 data published by the Office for National Statistics, shows the recorded population in Havering has increased in the last decade by 24,800 (10.4%), from around 237,200 in 2011 to 262,000 in 2021- the largest population ever recorded through a census in Havering.

The growth in Havering is higher than our nearest statistical neighbours (7.9%), London (7.7%) and England (6.6%) but lower than the North East London (NEL) region (11.1%). The biggest growth has been seen in 25-39 year olds (an increase of 26.5%) and young children, with the 0-4 age group in Havering seeing the second highest growth of all local authorities in the country.

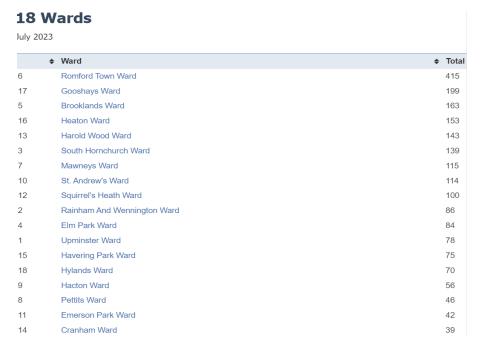
